What are the types of Animal Groups? This Animal Groups Worksheet includes 5 animal groups consisting of: Mammals; Mammals are warm-blooded vertebrate animals (animals with spines) and they typically have hair or fur. They also give birth to live young. Examples are horses, dogs, and humans. Fish; Fish are animals with gills and they don't have limbs or digits (fingers and toes).
