Act III, scene i: Before the castle. Summary. The third act begins with a bit of comic relief; a clown is mincing words with a few musicians, then has a little wordplay with Cassio, who bids the clown to go and see if Desdemona will speak with him. Iago enters, and Cassio tells him that he means to speak to Desdemona, so that she may clear things up with Othello.

Upon realizing that he murdered an innocent Desdemona, Othello admits he killed the most precious thing in his life. He asks his men to remember him as " [n]othing extenuate, / Nor set down ought in malice. " . And as " one that loved not wisely, but too well. / Of one not easily jealous, but being wrought, / Perplexed in the extreme. " . He then uses a weapon he had previously hidden in his bedroom to stab himself.

How does Iago trigger Othello's insecurities and exploit ...

Iago again says that his suspicions are likely false. He warns Othello against the dangers of "the green-eyed monster" (3.3.165-7) of jealousy, while at the same time noting that Desdemona did successfully deceive her father. Othello claims not to be jealous; though it is obvious from his manner that this is untrue. Finally, Iago counsels Othello to trust only what he sees, not Iago's suspicions.
