In the early 1900s, a style of guitar playing made well known by travelling medicine shows became known as ́ ragtime blues ́, or usually it was named ́ Piedmont Blues ́. The bouncy, joyful sound contrasted considerably with the slower, more sombrefeeling of the delta blues, which was generally performed in E, A or open tuning.

The rag was a modification of the march made popular by John Philip Sousa, with additional polyrhythms coming from African music. It was usually written in 2/4 or 4/4 time with a predominant left-hand pattern of bass notes on strong beats (beats 1 and 3) and chords on weak beats (beat 2 and 4) accompanying a syncopated melody in the right hand. . Ragtime blues guitar evolved from piano ragtime music, which introduced stop-time into barrel-house boogie to increase syncopation. Fingerstyle guitarists copied the left-hand characteristics of ragtime piano (the 'bum-chick' sound) and applied it to up-tempo blues. This exciting new dance music became known as ragtime blues or Piedmont. \$59
