Start your seeds 6 – 8 weeks before your last frost date. Plant them ¼ inch deep in a container filled with pre-moistened soil. I find that if I plant seeds in dry soil and then wet it, the soil and the seeds tend to float out of the container so I lightly water my soil first before planting my seeds. Once the seeds are planted, I do a more thorough watering.
